Why the BA Role Is Evolving

02

AI can speed up analysis, but judgment still belongs to the analyst.

AI can assist with meeting synthesis, document review, draft requirements, and data exploration

The BA still validates intent, confirms priorities, and manages stakeholder alignment

Modern BA value comes from context, traceability, governance, and business outcomes

The goal is not “AI writes everything”; the goal is faster, better-informed analysis

Core message

AI accelerates the work. The analyst remains responsible for business meaning, evidence, and final recommendation.



The Modern AI-Powered BA Profile

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A capability profile built on evidence, context, and value.

Business Needs

Clarifies the problem, stakeholders, priorities, and measurable outcomes

Data Validation

Checks metrics, SQL logic, schema meaning, and data quality

AI-Powered

Requirements

Creates user stories, acceptance criteria, rules, and traceability

AI Governance

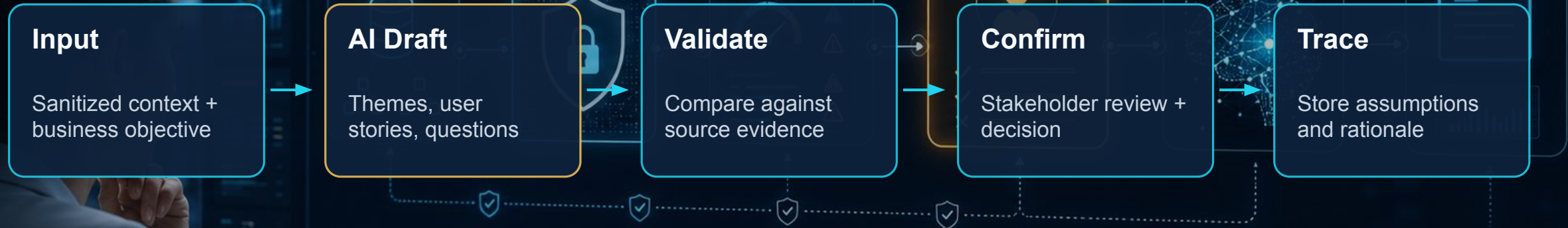
Defines oversight, limits, fallback, monitoring, and risk controls

**Modern BA value = business context + validated evidence
+ responsible AI use**

The Rule: AI Drafts, Humans Validate

04

Do not outsource judgment to the tool.



Practical safeguard

Use fictional or approved/sanitized transcripts in training
Never paste confidential meeting notes into unapproved public AI tools
Track open questions, assumptions, and source evidence

12-Week Roadmap at a Glance

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Three months, three capability phases, one portfolio.

Month 1

BA + Data Foundations

Requirements, process mapping, SQL, data validation

Month 2

AI-Augmented Analysis

Transcript synthesis, prompt workflows, AI-assisted SQL

Month 3

AI Solution + Portfolio

Governance, value assessment, case study, resume positioning

Weeks 1–2: Requirements and Process Analysis

06

Turn unclear business problems into structured analysis.

Problem statements, business needs, stakeholders, and outcomes

Interviews, workshops, user stories, acceptance criteria

As-Is and To-Be workflows, swimlanes, business rules

KPI thinking: cycle time, conversion, SLA, cost, value



Practice project

Reverse-engineer a broken checkout or onboarding workflow; identify inefficiencies and create a To-Be process.

Process Mapping: As-Is to To-Be

07

Show the business change before writing the solution.

As-Is: current workflow

Customer starts application → confusing form → missing document → manual review → delayed approval

Problems: rework, unclear ownership, slow cycle time



To-Be: improved workflow

Guided application → document checklist → automated validation → exception review → faster decision

Metrics: lower rework, faster cycle time, clearer status

BA value: make the current pain visible, design the improved flow, and define how success will be measured.

Weeks 3-4: SQL and Data Validation

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A modern BA should question reports, not blindly accept them.

SQL: SELECT, JOIN, GROUP BY, CASE, subqueries,
intro window functions
ERDs, data dictionaries, keys, relationships, and metric
definitions
Data quality checks: missing, duplicate, invalid,
inconsistent records
Validation: denominator errors, join mistakes, and
reconciliation

Project

Analyze a sample customer + transaction database.

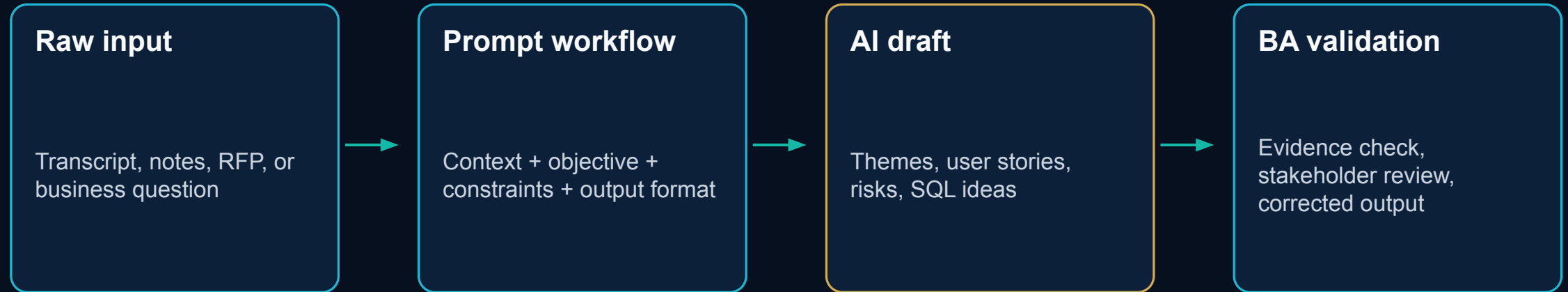
Metrics to calculate

Retention • Churn • Conversion • Average order value •
Revenue by segment

Month 2: AI-Augmented Analysis

09

Use AI to speed up analysis without removing review.



Important: this roadmap does not require Power BI Copilot. AI-assisted analytics can be taught with SQL, a sample database, Excel/Sheets, and an approved AI assistant.

Weeks 5–6: AI-Assisted Requirements Work

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Create reviewable drafts, not final truth.

Reusable prompt templates for meetings, workshops, and document analysis

Extract themes, decisions, contradictions, assumptions, and open questions

Draft user stories and acceptance criteria from validated evidence

Keep traceability from AI output back to source notes or transcript

Use a fictional stakeholder transcript.

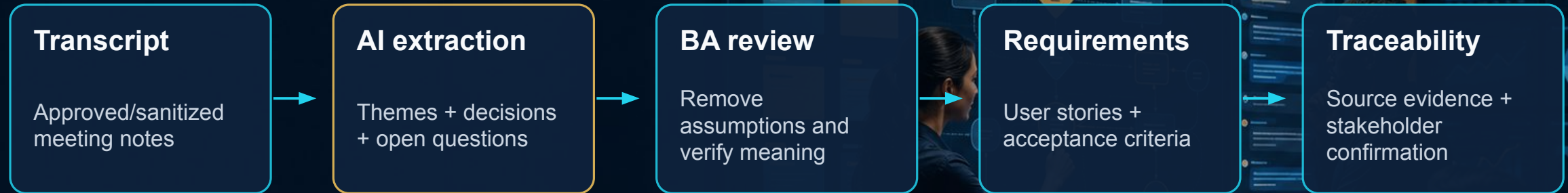
Deliverable

Meeting summary + decisions + open questions + draft requirements + user stories + acceptance criteria + traceability notes

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Messy conversation becomes structured analysis.

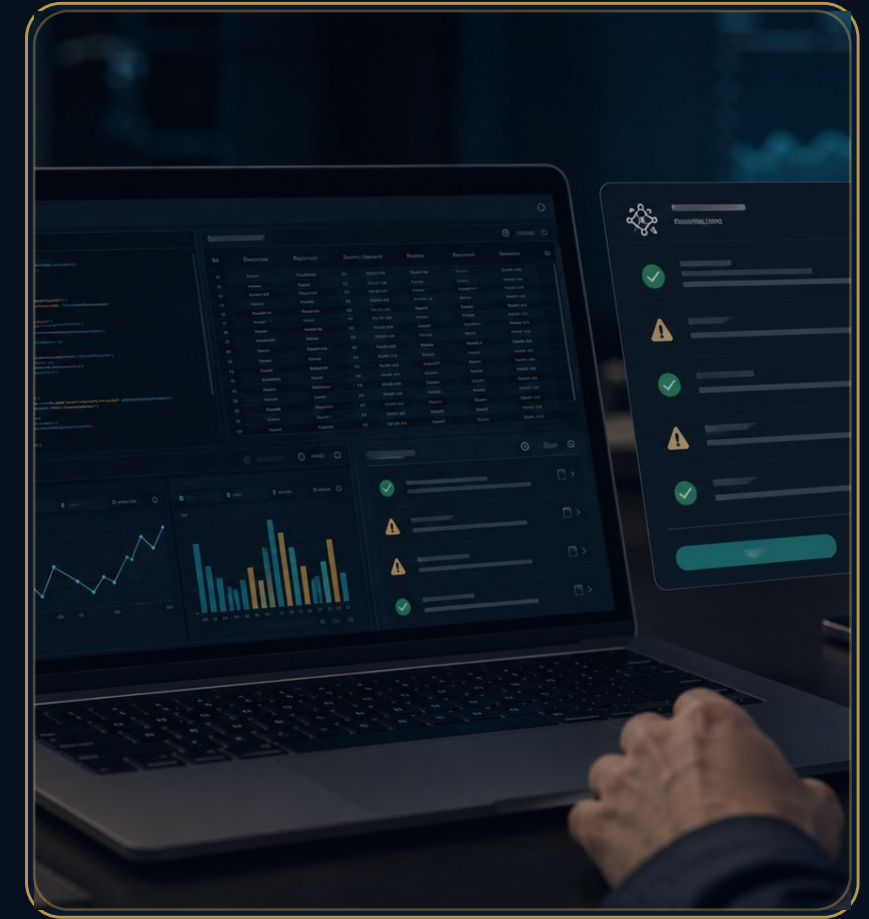
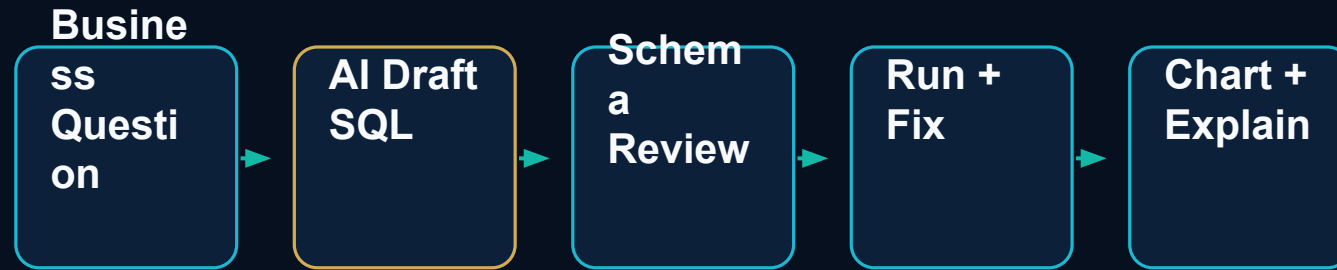


Do not claim AI created a final BRD. Claim AI helped generate a reviewable draft package that the BA validated.

Weeks 7–8: AI-Assisted SQL and Insight Validation

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Teach the workflow without relying on Power BI Copilot.



Use SQLite, DBeaver, DB Browser, Excel, Google Sheets, or Power BI Desktop

Ask AI for draft SQL, then verify tables, joins, filters, and metrics

Document errors found, corrected query, final result, and limitations

Month 3: AI Use Cases and Governance

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Analyze AI-enabled solutions, not only AI-generated documents.

Identify whether AI is the right solution for the business problem

Assess data readiness, affected users, risks, and operational impact

Define human oversight, fallback process, monitoring, and success metrics

Capture responsible AI requirements and open governance questions

Project example

Assess a customer-support assistant, claims summarizer, policy chatbot, or invoice-exception analyzer.

Weeks 9–10: Responsible AI Requirements

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Translate risk into testable business and control requirements.

Use Case

Business objective, users, process fit

Data

Source, privacy, quality, provenance

Oversight

Human review, escalation, fallback

Limits

Intended use, prohibited use,
confidence thresholds

Monitoring

Feedback, drift, incidents, improvement

Output: AI use-case assessment + risk register + responsible AI requirements + executive recommendation.

Weeks 11–12: Portfolio That Proves Capability

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Artifacts matter more than buzzwords.

Case Study

Business problem + stakeholder map

Process Maps

As-Is, To-Be, root cause

Requirements

User stories + acceptance criteria

Data Report

SQL validation + metrics

AI Workflow

Transcript-to-draft package

Governance

AI use-case risk + controls

Position yourself as an AI-fluent BA who validates evidence, improves processes, and connects AI to measurable value.

Resume and Interview Positioning

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Be modern, but do not exaggerate experience.

Avoid

“AI strategist” or “governance expert” after one small project. Avoid claiming final decisions came from AI.

Use instead

“Applied AI-assisted elicitation with human validation.”
“Validated AI-generated insights against SQL and source data.”
“Defined requirements, risks, controls, and success metrics.”

Interview story

I used AI to draft a requirements package from a fictional transcript, then validated each requirement against source evidence, corrected assumptions, and confirmed open questions.

Teaching principle: each phase must produce one visible artifact that can be reviewed, explained, and improved.

Final Summary and Next Step

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Understand. Validate. Design value. Build proof.

AI-powered BA skills are an extension of strong BA fundamentals, not a replacement for them
